Making the Graduation Happen

The organising partners of the Kent and Medway Apprentice Graduation Ceremony are delighted to be able to celebrate the county's amazing apprentices once again at the wonderful Rochester Cathedral.

Since the inaugural ceremony in 2019 the apprentice graduation ceremony is becoming a regular fixture in the county's event calendar. Back then we saw 90 apprentices graduate and today amazingly over 200!

Being able to celebrate the achievements of so many apprentices, with friends family, employers, providers and other stakeholder guests is a wonderful and cherished experience.

Today's ceremony sees a 40% increase on the record number of apprentices that graduated in 2022, and even more employers too, at a 24% increase with nearly 100 engaged across approximately 30 training providers. The ceremony also builds on its support of the health and care sector with more than 60 apprentices employed within NHS organisations.

The inclusivity of the ceremony also continues to be a core priority for the organisers, with 55% of our graduands being Level 2 or 3 apprentices, that would not normally get to experience a celebration of their achievements in a formal graduation format.

We are grateful as ever to all our sponsors and supporters, without whom we would not be able to offer this wonderful ceremony's gowning costs and photography without charge to our graduands. It is this support that distinguishes this graduation from others and ensures its role in promoting apprenticeship success at all levels and across multiple industry sectors. We also give thanks to the team at Rochester Cathedral who ensure we can enjoy this beautiful and stunning venue.

Finally, before you enjoy today's wonderful celebration of our apprentices, a special thank you to all employers and training providers for engaging so magnificently this year, and to our behind the scenes Graduation Ceremony Event Board organisation members for making it happen!

JO JAMES OBE
Chief Executive and Director, Kent Invicta Chamber of Commerce

Jo has worked in the businesses to business environment for over 35 years, but has been working at the interface between the public, private and education sectors since 2008. Having worked for Kent Invicta Chamber for many years, Jo became Chief Executive in 2008. Since that time she has established the Chamber as the leading business support organisation in the County. In 2019 Jo received the Outstanding Contribution to the Business Community at the Kent Excellence in Business Awards (KEIBAs), and was also awarded an Order of the British Empire (OBE) in the same year for her services to the Kent economy. Jo steps down as chief executive at the end of this year, leaving a fabulous legacy and support for apprenticeships in good hands and embodied in the county's Local Skills Improvement Plan.



CLLR LAUREN EDWARDS

Portfolio Holder for Economic and Social Regeneration and Inward Investment, Medway Council

Lauren Edwards is a Labour & Co-operative councillor for Rochester East and Warren Wood and was first elected in 2021. She is the Cabinet Member for Economic and Social Regeneration and Inward Investment in the new Labour and Co-operative administration on Medway Council elected in May 2023. In July 2023 she was selected as Labour's Parliamentary Candidate for Rochester and Strood.

In her Cabinet role, she is responsible for labour market planning and strategic skills development. She also sits on the boards of outside bodies focused on regional economic regeneration and skills, including the Kent and Medway Employment Taskforce. Medway Council supports local apprenticeships through both its Apprenticeship Academy and its Apprenticeship Advice Service.



DR ANTHONY MANNINGDean for Global and Lifelong Learning, University of Kent

Through his role at Kent, Anthony is responsible for apprenticeships, spanning levels 3 to 7, across 13 different standards for a network of 250 employers and 1300 apprentices. He is also responsible for the development, implementation and review of International activity which includes international student experience, pathways to higher education and online learning. Anthony is a Principal Fellow of AdvanceHE and a National Teaching Fellow. He has lived and worked in five countries and has led partnership development with organisations and universities in more than 25 countries. He is also the current Chair of the British Accreditation Council's Accreditation Committee which accredits academic and training institutions in the UK and around the world.



AIMEE JONES
Civil Engineering Degree Apprentice & Apprentice Ambassador, South East Apprentice Ambassador Network

When I started my apprenticeship journey I soon realised how much benefit this route holds, and I was shocked at how underrepresented apprenticeships were in schools and that negative stigmas around apprenticeships still sometimes remain. To help solve this problem, I joined the Apprenticeship Ambassador Network, a network dedicated to encouraging more employers to use high-quality apprenticeships and inspiring more young people to pursue apprenticeships as a vibrant career route. As an ambassador, I have been dedicated to promoting apprenticeships in schools and linking up with the wider network to understand the challenges and what can be done, which has been both empowering and fulfilling.



JONATHAN SHAW
Strategic Director, Kent Further Education

Jonathan is the Strategic Director for Kent Further Education (KFE). Jonathan was previously Chief Executive of the think tank Policy Connect. Jonathan's variable career has included being a farm worker, care assistant and social worker before being elected to Parliament for three terms between 1997-2010. During his time as an MP he was Minister for Disabled People. Now focused on post 16 education and skills, he is a great advocate of apprenticeships and the apprentice graduation ceremony, helping ensure KFE's ongoing support for the event.

CARLY RYAN Maintenance & Operations Engineering Technician



Since school, I knew I wanted to follow in my sibling's footstep and become an Engineer. I loved the idea of being part of something that can influence or change the world, and to achieve it through an apprenticeship was without a doubt the best option for me. I considered university, but I loved the idea of learning practical skills at the same time as learning the theoretical side, plus you gain a qualification without thousands of pounds of tuition fees.

I started my Engineering Apprenticeship in 2017 after completing my A Levels. The company who supported me through my apprenticeship is Aeromet International, an aerospace and defence industry business. Alongside completing my Level 3 Mechanical Engineering qualification, I also achieved Level 4 Higher National Certificate Mechanical Engineering. Once a week I attended a training provider called IPS International.

It took 4 years of studying and many, many assignments to achieve Distinctions across the board. I believe I have been successful because I genuinely loved the work and the mode of learning.

I am forever grateful to IPS International and Aeromet International ect so rare for women in this industry! My hope is that becoming a

for giving me the opportunity to study a subject so rare for women in this industry! My hope is that becoming a female Engineer will not be such an unusual thing in the future and hopefully my experience will help encourage other women to consider a similar career path.



GEORGIA CHELL Accounts / Finance Assistant

I started my apprenticeship career in 2020 with MidKent College, originally for a customer service role. After showing interest in Finance they created an apprentice role in the Corporate Finance team.

Upon completing my Level 2 in Accounting, I was offered a Level 3 apprenticeship. I felt as an apprentice that I was looked after and really invested in with their ongoing support. It showed that apprenticeships lead to progression. I was always passionate to progress and continuously learn and develop. The apprenticeship route was perfect for me! I am now a part of the Apprentice Ambassador Network for the Southeast, where I am continuing my passion, inspiring others to consider apprenticeships.

I have been extremely lucky with my apprenticeship. The key is to keep going because there were times where I really struggled with level 3. I look back now, and I am forever grateful I had motivating colleagues and managers around me who supported me.



After my Level 3, I would wish to move up to Level 4 and maybe even one day go onto ACCA to become chartered. By doing an apprenticeship I have a much clearer vision of where I want to be in the future and what I want to achieve. And guess what, I am graduating again in 2023!

SHARON WILLIAMS Deputy Operations Manager in Urology

I became very aware when looking at applications that came through to us, the qualifications people had. I knew I needed a qualification to progress, which is why I did the Team Leader Level 3 apprenticeship with EKC Group and I have just moved into a new role as a Deputy Operations Manager.

In an appraisal at work, where I was asked about what I would like to achieve in the future, I said I would like to progress and gain a qualification. Internal training was suggested, which would have been fine, but when apprenticeships started up again after lockdown there was no question, that was what I wanted to do, and I submitted an application then and there - driven by my desire to continue with education and progress. I walked in on that first day probably more nervous than any of the full-time students, but they probably just thought I was a tutor.

I am convinced that if I didn't complete this qualification, I would not have been considered for senior roles. I also enjoyed being in the classroom, the teachers, the learning, comradery, and the facilities were great. I am considering doing the Level 5 Operations Manager in the future, but it is a lot longer a course,



so that will be something I will revisit later on. I will take a break from education for now to enjoy the new role, because you really do have to devote the time, but I have enjoyed it and I think I will miss that.

AIMEE JONES Civil Engineer



I started my Civil Engineering Degree apprenticeship with Mott MacDonald in 2021, after completing my A-Levels in Mathematics, Physics and Geography. I joined the Water Consultancy Division within Mott MacDonald, specifically in the Dams, Rivers and Geotech team.

I chose an apprenticeship, as I wanted to learn the theories of civil engineering alongside applying the practical in the industry, getting a variety of experiences and learning new technical skills. Since starting my apprenticeship I have worked on a variety of different projects from designing replacement floodplain storage areas, to delivering a river restoration project to assessing structures for scour risk.


